In the Ford model line, the role of the Aerostar cargo van was left unfilled; the closest successor is the Ford Transit Connect, introduced in 2010. All production was sourced from the now-closed St. Louis Assembly Plant in Hazelwood, Missouri. Along with restyled A-pillars and a completely new front fascia, the Carousel received a wagon-style roofline with wrap-around window glass; in a key indication of its future as family-oriented vehicle, the Carousel wore a rear tailgate with a dropdown rear window with simulated exterior woodgrain trim. 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In 1990, coinciding with the introduction of the E4WD Aerostar, a 4.0 L version of the Cologne V6 was introduced; while standard with all-wheel drive versions, it became an option on rear-wheel drive XLT and Eddie Bauer trims as well. In 1997, the 4.0 L V6 became paired with the first five-speed automatic transmission fitted in a US market minivan. The system shifted traction to the front wheels as it detected rear wheel spin, with no driver input required. Sharing the 119-inch wheelbase with the standard-length version, the extended-length Aerostar added 14 inches to the rear body. 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Permanent 4wheel drive remained available, only in extendedlength models. No more manualshift Aerostars went on sale. Radios got larger buttons. Optional premium sound systems were upgraded to 24 watts. The optional autoclimate system was redesigned with new air conditioning controls. The 5speed came only with the 4.0liter engine, which was standard on 4WD Aerostars. This minivan was discontinued at the end of the year. The 4wheeldrive system introduced in 1990 was permanently engaged. Under normal conditions, onethird of the engine's torque is sent to front wheels and twothirds to the rear. A center differential locks in a 5050 split if wheelspin is detected. Manual shift disappeared after '94. Ride quality is another drawback, even with the Aerostar's long wheelbase.
